HTML Buttons

HTML allows us to create buttons on web pages.

Buttons can be used to trigger actions, submit forms, or navigate to other pages.

Buttons are created using the `<button>` tag or the `<input>` tag with the type attribute set to "button". Both approaches works, but the `<button>` tag is more often used, so our focus will be only on it.

The `<button>` tag is used to create a clickable button on a web page. It can contain text, images, or other HTML elements.

HTML Buttons in forms

HTML buttons can also be used in forms to allow users to submit the form or perform other actions. It can have a type attribute set to "submit" to create a submit button or "reset" to create a reset button. Here's an example:

In this example, the form contains two input elements for the username and password, followed by a button element with a type attribute set to "submit" to allow the user to submit the form.
